# Boost Aadhaar use for good governance, PM tells states

NEW DELHI: States should maximise the use of Aadhaar in the interest of good governance to allow better percolation of benefits and plug leakages, Prime MinisterNarendraModisaidon Monday.

Modi, who also praised the Supreme Court for its recent judgment on Aadhaar, was speaking at his first interaction herewithbureaucrats, including the chief secretaries of 30 states and UnionTerritories.

Modi also asked them to list the bestpractices in their states. The NITI Aayog, which organised the day-long conference, will compile these practices and study them,Aayogvice chairman Arvind Panagariya said later.

"ThePrimeMinisterstressedon competitive federalism among states," he said.

Panagariya said underemployment is probably the biggest economic challenge that India faces right now and added that rapidgrowth can beachieved by moving workers out of agriculture to industry andfromsmaller enterprises to bigger ones.

Panagariya'sremarkscomeat a time when the three-year-old governmentisfacing a barrage of criticism onjoblessgrowth.Last month, Panagariya, indefence of the government, said the claims
were"somewhatbogus".
"Underemploymentis probably the biggest economic challenge we face... as many as 44.2 croreworkersor $91.2 \%$ of the total wereemployedinagricultureor enterprises with nine or fewer workers," he said.

Panagariya said thatexcessive employment in agriculture ( $46.9 \%$ ) with lower output ( $18 \%$ ) was slowinggrowth, and tackling that is the way to achieving growth.
"Attheaggregatemacrolevel, bringing about rapid growth is mostcritical-nomajorsuccess in poverty alleviation is likely withoutit," the economistsaid.
"If we set the output per worker in agriculture equal to one, then output per worker in industry isfive and that in services 3.8," he said.
