Theterms of reference of the committee include studying various issues relating to data protection, recommending principles that need to be considered for data protection in India and
suggesting adraft dataprotection bill. The IT Ministry, in consultation with the chairperson and other members, will provide the panel "necessary information" withineight weeks toenable the newly constituted body to start its discussions on the subject.
