Seniors citizens to get Aadhaar smart cards

Senior citizens would receive Aadhaar-based smart cards. Sources said, these cards would contain health details of senior citizens.

Presenting the Union Budget 2017-18 on Wednesday, Mr Jaitley said that the pilot service of these cards would take off in 15 cities initially beginning this year. "Very soon, we will be introducing an Aadhaar-based payment system which will use one's biometrics for transactions," Mr Jaitley said.
