# Aadhaar has more value than civic certificates: HC

NEWDELH:TheCentre-issuedAadhaar card has equal or more value than certificates issued municipal bodies and panchayats, the Delhi high court said earlier thisweek.

The court'sruling comeswhile itwas deciding on an appeal by a person who was sentenced tolife imprisonment for sodomising a six-year-old boy.
"The Aadhaar card, being a document issued by the Centre, has equalormorevalue thancertificates issued by a corporation, municipal authority, orpanchayat," thebench of Justice SPGarg andJusticeCHariShankarsaid.

The bench added that it differed from an earlier Madras high courtruling which had said that the Aadhaar card could not be used as proof of age, as it did not mention the holder's date of birth but the age in years.

Terming it as "distinction without a difference", the court said, "....As such, the document (Aadhaar) is only to be referred to, by way of evidence for ascertaining the age of the person con-
cerned, and the rule does not require, either expressly or by necessary implication, that the date of birth shouldfigure on the body of the said document."
"Indeed, when the document mentions the ageitself, no better proof could be sought, for ascertaining the age of the person concerned. We, therefore, regretfully express ourinability to subscribe to the view adopted by the high courtof Madrasin Paneerselvam (supra)," the court ruled.

The bench noted that "psychosocial deviancy andaberrantsexual proclivities are writ large on the offence committed by the appellantona six-year-old boy."

Eventhough the bench upheld the conviction of the accused, it reduced the sentence to 15 years.
"While, therefore, we are of the view that the minimum punishment imposable for aggravated penetrative sexualassault, under Section6 of thePOCSOAct,i.e. 10 years rigorous imprisonment, would be insufficient in the presentcase, directingincarceration of the appellant, for life, would certainly be disproportionate to the offence committed by him."
